

The BARST Degree at the University of Alberta is designed for a wide variety of disciplines in the field of Recreation, Sports and Tourism. The following outlines the recommended pathway of coursework a BARST student would follow when pursuing Professional Membership with ATRA upon graduation. Alternative pathways are possible as long as the degree coursework criteria set out by ATRA are met (please see the [ATRA website](#) for current coursework criteria details), Courses may be taken in a different order than what is shown below.

ATRA Eligibility is ultimately determined by ATRA upon time of application for Professional Membership. Students should communicate with ATRA to determine which courses are most appropriate.

NCTRC Eligibility is ultimately determined by NCTRC upon time of application for CTRS designation. NCTRC acceptance is decided on an individual student basis. The previous identified NCTRC eligible courses are based on previous acceptance by individual students. Absolute acceptance to be determined on an individual basis by NCTRC only. Students must apply to change their degree by the application deadline and meet admission requirements – see your Academic Advisor for information.
