Global Leisure Debate Responses to challenges on Leisure, Mental Health and Well-Being

Global Leisure Debate: Responses to Challenges on Leisure, Mental **Health and Well-Being**

By John Dattilo, WLO Board member and Professor at Penn State University

The debate occurred June 9/10 for approximately an hour as part of the WLO Knowledge Sharing and Networking Experience. World Leisure Organisation (WLO) Chair, Joanne Schroeder, moderated the session with participants, Simone Fullagar from Griffith University in Australia, Joe Pavelka from Mount Royal University in Canada, and me from Penn State University in the USA, and a WLO Board member. In preparation for the discussion, we read transcripts from interviews with Alfonso Jimenez, Director of Research and Innovation at Ingesport-GO fit, Martyn Allison, Chief Cultural and Leisure Officers Association Honorary Member, and Joe Taylor, Founder of The Wave Project UK. These knowledgeable practitioners discussed challenges, inequalities, barriers, and opportunities associated with

mental health and well-being within the leisure context. The WLO Secretariate, Cristina Ortega Nuere, and the WLO staff, developed three 5-minute videos with each video featuring one of the three invited participants providing our reactions to the transcripts identified as WLO Pre-Experience Videos. Many of those attending the debate reviewed the videos prior to the discussion.

We discussed ways leisure service professionals can address mental health challenges and help people achieve well-being identifying that our mental health exists on a fluctuating continuum influenced by intersectionality of characteristics including gender, race, ethnicity, ability, and many more. We also recognized value in distinguishing leisure from free time as well as recreation and sport activities, since leisure extends beyond utilitarian purposes of recuperating from work, diverting our attention, and conspicuously consuming goods. Connections between mental health and leisure become apparent when we recognize that leisure is an intrinsically valuable subjective state of being involving meaningful virtuous actions characterized by authenticity resulting in a sense of identity and agency intertwining with happiness and, ultimately, our ability to flourish (Dattilo & Lopez Frias, 2021).

Consequently, addressing challenges to our leisure as it connects with mental health and well-being is a social justice issue requiring us to consider implications of power dynamics (Lopez Frias & Dattilo, 2020). As the world continues to battle the COVID pandemic and associated challenges to our well-being, it is encouraging to realize that our interactions embedded within culture create power, and, therefore, we can shift power over individuals that result in oppression and marginalization to power that supports people in solidarity to achieve leisure (Lopez Frias & Dattilo, 2021). We concluded that leisure service providers can address challenges to mental health and well-being by promoting inclusive leisure

services that create a sense of belonging and welcome everyone to experience leisure (Dattilo, 2021a). We also acknowledged the value in demonstrating a willingness to make accommodations that promote equitable leisure experiences through various strategies such as leisure education (Dattilo, 2021b).

I am humbled by the invitation to participate in the debate, am thankful for having engaged in such an intellectually stimulating experience, and I look forward to future WLO Knowledge Sharing and Networking Experiences.

The proposal had been submitted by current Board Member Atara Sivan, Hong Kong Baptist University, and Tony Veal, University of Technology Sydney, co-convenors of the Taskforce to Revise the WLO Charter for Leisure, 2017-2020. The goals of the new SIG are to promote research and teaching on the topic of human rights and leisure, based on the principles set out in the WLO Charter for Leisure, and to enhance the profile of leisure rights among governments, leisure policymakers, practitioners and researchers and within the UN human rights system. The 3rd International Recreation and Sports Management **Congress takes place in Turkey** with the support of the WLO

Organized by the Turkish Recreation Studies and Research Association, the 3rd International Recreation and Sports Management Congress was held in Antalya, Turkey, on May 16-19, 2022 with the support of the World Leisure Organization (WLO) through its naming rights programme. The Congress hosted 262 scientists of different fields from 45 universities. The main theme of the congress was determined as "Recreation: manage differently, live better" and the content of the symposiums was planned accordingly.

The committee heads of 3rd International Recreation and Sports Management Congress were as follows: the President of Turkish Recreation Studies and Research Association, Prof. Dr. Bülent GÜRBÜZ, as the President of The Congress, Dr. Funda KOÇAK, as the Congress General Secretary, Prof. Dr. Metin ARGAN, as the President of Sports Management Science Board, Prof. Dr. Hamdi Alper GÜNGÖRMÜŞ, as the President of Recreation Science Board, and Dr. Tennur YERLİSU-LAPA, as the President of Award Committee.

Total of 191 scientific study were presented during the Congress. Within the scope of the congress, 38 sessions were held as 36 oral presentation sessions. Also, four symposiums, three international symposiums and one sector symposium, were organized with the participation of five invites speakers.



The invited speakers were Prof. Dr. Atara SIVAN from Hong Kong Baptist University Department of Education Studies, the Editor-in-Chief of World Leisure Journal, President of World Leisure Academy, Founder and Chairperson of World Leisure Organization; Prof. Dr. Rasul A. Mowatt from North Carolina State University Departments of Parks, Recreation and Tourism Management, Co-Editor of Leisure Science; and Prof. Dr. Kang-Jae "Jerry" Lee from North Carolina State University Departments of Parks, Recreation and Tourism Management.

The 3rd International Recreation and Sports Management Congress started on May 16, 2022, with the opening ceremony. In the ceremony, the Honorary President of Recreation Studies and Research Association Prof. Dr. Ümit KESİM, Prof. Dr. Atara SIVAN and the president of Recreation Studies and Research Association Prof. Dr. Bülent GÜRBÜZ made their speeches. Prof. Dr. Atara SIVAN made a speech on "World Leisure Organization 2022" in the opening ceremony. The opening ceremony ended with the plaque award for the supporting institutions. Turkish Curling Federation President Prof. Dr. Kenan ŞEBİN, School Sports Federation President Asst. Prof. Ömür Fatih KARAKULLUKÇU, Tureks International Fair General Coordinator Zafer ARSLAN and Club Calimera Serra Palace Hotel General Manager Ahmet MEVLÜTOĞLU received their plaques for supporting the 3rd International Recreation and Sports Management Congress.

On May 17, 2022, Prof. Dr. Atara SIVAN presented her speech titled "Leisure and Recreation for all: Education for Social Inclusion". Prof. Dr. Rasul A. Mowatt presented his speech titled "Revisiting Leisure and Recreation during COVID in the United States: Implications for a "Post"- COVID Reality" on May 17th, 2022. After their speeches, the invited speakers had a Q&A session with the academicians who followed their speech and academic works.

Prof. Dr. Kang-Jae "Jerry" Lee presented his speech titled "What Makes People Happy? The Importance of Leisure, Recreation and Sport" on May 18th, 2022. On May 18th, 2022, Tureks International Fair General Director Nergis ARSLAN presented her speech titled "Atraction-Recreation Industry and Happy Cities", and the President of Turkish Hoteliers Federation Sururi **CORABATIR** presented his speech on "Tourism after Pandemic".

On May 19, 2022, the closing and award ceremony was held. The closing speech was made by the President of Recreation Studies and Research Association, Prof. Dr. Bülent GÜRBÜZ. There were four categories for awards as "Sports Management", "Recreation", "Oral Presentation on Recreation in English" and "Ümit KESİM Award". After the award ceremony, Commemoration of Atatürk, Youth and Sports Day was celebrated.






Whitepaper "Climate Action through Regeneration -Unlocking the Power of Communities and Nature through Tourism"
